The Indigenous peoples of North America are resilient. Residential Schools operated between the 1870's and 1990's, with the implicit intent to assimilate Indigenous people. An Indigenous Child Removal Program operated between 1940's and 1980's (sometimes referred to as the 60's Scoop) with a similar mandate of placing Indigenous youth in non-Indigenous homes. Nevertheless, Indigenous peoples in Treaty 8 Territory, Canada and beyond continue to thrive by building and celebrating their:

- Unique histories
